

ABOUT THE EVENT

Today, it is a matter of concern that the propagation of bamboo has remained peripheral to our re-greening efforts. A major reason for this situation is the systemic reliance on promoting trees as a method of addressing our forestry needs, and of late in tackling climate change. Bamboo cultivation, meanwhile, despite all its potential, remains neglected. The Bamboo Society of India was established in 1988-89 to fill this critical gap in our systems approach, and to promote the cultivation and propagation of this plant as part of an agro-forestry approach to tackle environmental degradation. Much progress has been achieved since, and there is still a long way to go. To assist in this process of propagating bamboo, the Bamboo Society of India's Karnataka Chapter had organized a Bamboo Cultural Festival on 18th September 2019 at Lalbagh Botanical Gardens, on the occasion of World Bamboo Day. World Bamboo Day is an international event recognized by the UN to create awareness about the significance of this wonder material BAMBOO in present times. The event was propagated to make Bangalore the first city to launch BAMBOO nationally and be a part of this change that is taking place globally. The Chief Guest of this special and unprecedented event were octogenarian Mr. S. G. Neginhal, IFS (Retd.) who set off the greening movement in Bangalore and many other metropolises across India during the 1980s. Mr. Punathi Sridhar, IFS, PCCF and HoFF, Department of Forest, Government of Karnataka graced the occasion along with other dignitaries. WORLD BAMBOO DAY 2019 SCOPE:

The World Bamboo Day was launched as a flagship event to support and bring Bamboo to the forefront and encourage its usage as a sustainable material in the daily life of common man which included workshops on the multiple uses of bamboo, a special bamboo music concert, an unique bamboo fabric based fashion show, and sales of bamboo based food and handicrafts, etc. Turn out Over 10,000 footfalls comprising of everyday visitors, common people, students of architecture and design faculties, professionals in the fields of architecture, product design, fashion designing, civil engineering, art, ecology, etc. The event was a huge success in itself with people from all walks of life visiting the event. AGNII began as an entertainment group performing fire dance and drum shows and today has metamorphosed into an ART for a CAUSE group where a group of boys came together with a passion to see the world smile and dance with joy. A group of youngsters from Kerala trying to preserve Valluvanadan art form with indigenous percussion instruments made of Bamboo spread a vibe across the audience. Fashion show by students of INIFD fashion design institute with the use of Bamboo fabric. Karnataka Bamboo Mission Distribution of Bamboo saplings to the farmers supported by the National Bamboo Mission by the hands of our guests. The objective of this event was to promote the cultivation of Bamboo for development of Bamboo industry throughout the state leading to development throughout the country. Dr Alka Bhargava, IFS, Director Bamboo Mission attended the Festival accompanied with 18 IFS officers added a limelight to the whole event. Bamboo workshop for the hands-on bamboo tree workshop participants from different walks of life joined hands to complete the structure. The workshop was organized by Centre for Green Building Material and Technology (CGBMT), Bengaluru. A guided workshop under the guidance of architects from Manasaram Architects and artisans from CGBMT. Participants learnt various techniques involved in construction with bamboo. DIY – Bamboo handicraft workshop A handicraft DIY Bamboo workshop headed by the artisans of CGBMT, professionals from Development Commissioner (Handicrafts), volunteers, interns and architects from Manasaram architects. The idea of the workshop was participants could make the artefacts and handicrafts under the guidance of professionals and take it with them; the workshop was a success with active participation from school children, students from different fields, day-to-day visitors, etc.

Exhibition was an initiative to increase awareness in the community regarding sustainable development, to promote bamboo as a green material so that the students, architects, professionals from various fields and commoners could see the variety of bamboo products offered in the market which included bamboo fabrics, food, handicrafts, etc. The idea was to have a long-term benefit through positive public relations and ethical standards, to create a platform to work towards the betterment of the society and community.
